School Parent Involvement Policy October 20,2012

Bridger School will involve parents in the development of its school plan.

- The school will invite parents to participate in the development of the school plan with our community council which has five parent members. Information, including academic data, State and Federal allocations, personnel, and instructional strategies will be given to parent representatives as part of a planning review process that will occur over a two to six week period for each plan.
- Parents will review information, attend scheduled meetings and give input into the development of the School Improvement Plan, Title I Plan, School Trust Land Plan, and the School Technology Plan.
- The Logan City School District Board will give final approval of each plan.

Bridger School will involve parents in the process of school review and improvement.

- Share the achievement data for all students and subgroups with parents.
- Invite input from parents regarding LEA and school goals.
- Discuss scientifically-based research instructional practices.
- Give direction in securing research-based curriculum materials that align with goals.

Bridger School will provide coordination and technical assistance to promote quality parental involvement activities.

- Parents will be invited to give input each fall and spring as plans are developed and results are reviewed.
- The school administrator and teachers will participate in annual training on parent involvement.

Bridger School will build the school and parent capacity for strong parental involvement.

- Schedule an annual parent involvement seminar to build effective parental involvement strategies.
- The school will allocate Title I funds to support two parent liaison positions.

Bridger School will coordinate parental involvement strategies with other programs.

- Representatives from other programs (i.e., Americorp, America Reads, Bear River Mental Health, Utah State University, and Logan Park and Recreation) will be encouraged to cosponsor the annual parent involvement seminar with Title I.
- Responsive school teams will make parental involvement policy a part of their planning at least twice a year.

Bridger School will conduct an annual parental involvement evaluation.

- In the spring, our Community Council will be given a Title I Parent Involvement Evaluation Form and asked to complete the evaluation and provide input on how the school might improve support for parental involvement.
- The school will participate in ISQ surveys through Utah State University to gauge parental satisfaction with key involvement indicators. The survey results will be reviewed by the Community Council and used to inform planning decisions.

Bridger School will ensure parents are involved in a variety of activities.

- The school will submit an annual report of successful parent involvement activities.
- In the annual training for the administrator and teacher, the district will share identified successful parental involvement activities. Our school will share ideas with the PTA President and Community Council.
- The principal will annually report to the district how Title I funds were used to support effective parental involvement strategies.
